WHAT IS TO BE RECYCLED?

HOW TO PREPARE IT

Effective January 1, 2008, the Township Recycling regulations changed to the following: **all glass, plastic, tin and aluminum recyclable items can be placed in the same container for curbside pickup by the Township Recycling Department.** Residents can place these items at the curb in containers no larger than 40 gallons. The schedule for collection of recycling material will remain the same; there are no changes in service. The remaining material (newspaper, magazines and cardboard) are to be prepared using existing regulations that are described in The Recycling Booklet. Residents who wish to continue to separate their recycling material can do so at the Recycling Center on North Railroad Avenue, which is open Monday through Friday 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and on Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Residents in Fardale can still separate items at Co. #4 Firehouse on Fardale Avenue on Saturdays between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. (Please check the schedule for the Saturdays this service is not available). If there are any questions, please call the Department of Public Works (201) 529-3344.

NEWSPAPERS:

Newspapers must be bundled and string-tied. NO brown bags, magazines or junk mail are to be included in the bundles.

Bundles should not be more than 30 pounds in weight.

MAGAZINES:

Magazines must be bundled and string-tied.

NO newspapers, brown bags, or junk mail are to be included in the bundles.

Bundles should be no more than 30 pounds in weight.

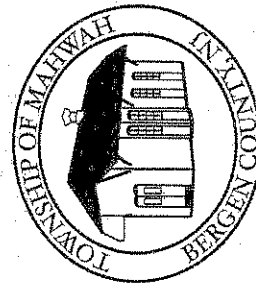
CARDBOARD:

Cardboard should be folded or cut and string-tied in bundles weighing no more than 30 pounds.

For large amounts of cardboard, call the Recycling

Center for special arrangements.

ALL GLASS, ALUMINUM, AND TIN LEFT AT CURBSIDE MUST BE IN REUSABLE CONTAINERS! ALL ITEMS LEFT CURBSIDE IN PAPER OR PLASTIC BAGS WILL BE LEFT AT THE CURB.

■. The following items may be dropped off at the Recycling Center located at 142 North Railroad Avenue:

- AUTO BATTERIES Car batteries only
- HOUSEHOLD BATTERIES Barrels provided for disposal
- CARDBOARD Must be cut and bundled
- SCRAP METAL All metal waste and household appliances
- NEWSPAPER No brown or plastic bags
- MAGAZINES No brown or plastic bags
- GLASS Containers provided for deposit
- PLASTIC Barrels provided for deposit
- TIN CANS Barrels provided for deposit
- ALUMINUM Barrels provided for deposit
- MIXED PAPER...Office files, computer, brown bags, all paper products
- ELECTRONICS Computers, TVs, radios, microwaves

The Township Recycling Center does not accept used motor oil, antifreeze, tires of any size, paint, paint cans or propane tanks of any size. These items can be disposed of through the Bergen County Hazardous Waste Collection Program. Contact 201-807-5825 for further information.

In addition, refrigerators and air conditioners are not accepted at the Recycling Center. They are picked up at no charge by calling Suburban Disposal at 1-973-227-7020.

GRASS CLIPPINGS, LEAVES & BRUSH

GRASS CLIPPINGS

Curbside pick-up will start April 12, 2012 and continue through Sept. 28, 2012. Pick-up will be on Thursday and Friday of every week. Grass will only be picked-up in BIODEGRADABLE PAPER BAGS. The Township will not supply biodegradable bags, they can be purchased at local stores. Residents may choose to dispose of their clippings by means of composting. Composting is the natural breakdown of the clippings. The following tips may help speed up the process of composting:

- periodically turn grass over
- add sand and lime to reduce any odors
- add water

Residents who choose to use the service of the Recycling Department are to use the following schedule:

Residents who live in Recycling Sections 1, 2 and 3 will have their grass clippings picked up on Thursdays.
 Residential Sections 4, 5 and 6 will be picked up on Fridays.
 All grass clippings can also be disposed of at the Recycling Center, Saturday from 7:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m..

GRASS CLIPPING DROP OFF

If you wish to bring your grass to the Center you may do so from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. April 2 continuing through September 29, 2012.

LEAVES

Leaves will be picked up on a continuous schedule from October 15, 2012 through December 7, 2012. During the leaf season your grass clippings can be mixed with the leaves left at the curb.

REQUIREMENTS FOR CURBSIDE LEAF PICK-UP ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- Leaves must be piled at the curb, NOT the road.
- Leaves in plastic bags will not be picked up.
- NO brush, branches, or stones are to be mixed in with the leaves.

LEAVES WILL NOT BE PICKED UP IF NOT CORRECTLY PREPARED.

CHRISTMAS TREES

The Township Public Works Department will collect Christmas trees curbside starting the week of January 3, 2012 through January 27, 2012. Condo Associations with their own dropoff sites will have trees collected starting the week of January 16, 2012.

BRUSH

The 2012 brush season will start April 14, 2012 and will conclude on September 29, 2012.

There will be NO CURBSIDE BRUSH PICK-UP offered by the Township. All brush disposal will be done at the recycling center ONLY. Residents can bring their brush to the Recycling Center on **SATURDAYS BETWEEN 7:30 a.m. AND 12:30 p.m. NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Brush disposed of at the Center (SATURDAY ONLY) may be done between 7:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. and must be prepared as follows:

- Anything under four (4) feet must be bundled.
- Any brush over four (4) feet must have stems or butts facing the same way.
- All stumps and roots must be removed.

Firewood, roots and logs may be disposed of at the Center (SATURDAY ONLY) between 7:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m.

Any changes, additions, or deletions to the schedule will be brought to your attention through local newspapers (Suburban News).

Solutions to Stormwater Pollution

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.

As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to help protect our water.

Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that require little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it. Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.
- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.
- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.
- Recycle used motor oil.
- Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.

Keep pollution out of storm drains

- Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.
- Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

Clean up after your pet

- Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.
- An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
- Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:
 - Use newspapers, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.
 - Dispose of wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.
 - Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

Don't feed wildlife

- Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese, in public areas.
- Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding in these areas.

Don't litter

- Place litter in trash receptacles.
- Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.
- Participate in community cleanups.

Dispose of yard waste properly

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.
- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.
- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.
