

Havemeyer House

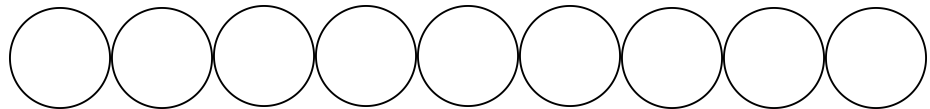
Before George Washington was the first president of the United States, he was a general in the Revolutionary War. He led patriot troops into battle against the British. These troops traveled across the 13 colonies during the War. In fact, they even traveled through the area that is now Mahwah! The land where the Havemeyer House is was originally home to a different house. This house was called the Andrew Hopper House. George Washington used it as his headquarters multiple times during the Revolutionary War. His troops would set up camp around the house, where Washington would review his plans.

Henry Hager moved into the house in 1850. He built a larger house next to the Andrew Hopper House. In 1878, Theodore Havemeyer bought the property. He expanded the second house, which is called the Havemeyer House. While doing so, he tore down the Andrew Hopper House to make room for the larger house. However, a fireplace from the Andrew Hopper House was incorporated into the Havemeyer house. This was a fireplace that Washington used. The Havemeyer House was made in the colonial style with beautiful details.

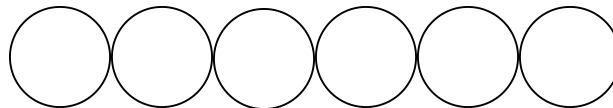

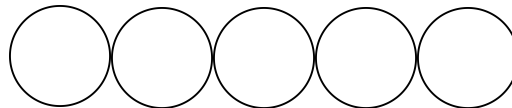

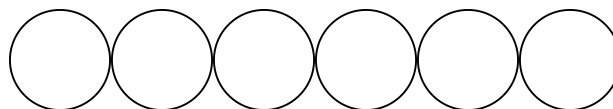
